Societal Challenges



- Concerns of citizens and society/EU policy objectives (climate, environment, energy, transport etc.) cannot be achieved without innovation

- The Horizon 2020 societal challenge of 'Health, demographic change and wellbeing' for the years 2014 and 2015 includes:
 - 32 topics in the 'personalising health and care' focus area call, and
 - 10 topics in the 'co-ordination activities' call.

Work programme Bi-annual (2014-2015)

- A small number of additional topics designed to support the implementation of the challenge will be included later and will not be subject to calls for proposals.
- The total budget available will be approximately €1.06bn.
- The Societal challenge "Health, Demographic Change And Wellbeing" is also implemented by the:
 - Innovative Medicines Initiative (IMI),
 - The European and Developing countries Clinical Trials Partnership (EDCTP),
 - Active and Assisted Living programme (AAL)

The Work Programme



Principles:



- One work programme for seamlessness in Horizon 2020* (except ERC, JRC, EIT);
- > 2+1 structure with budget information included;
 - To be user friendly. Will make better use of web tools.
 - Will include sub-challenge areas, not shopping lists of topics less prescription
 - Focus areas:
 - > To be implemented by a dedicated call
 - ➤ May be contributed to by a variety of parts of H2020
 - > Each should identify portfolio of actions throughout innovation cycle,
- Co-operative projects maintained
